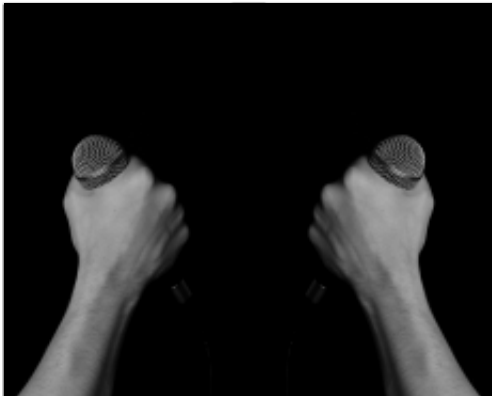


SJIS NETWORKING AND OPEN QUESTIONS MINISYMPOSIUM

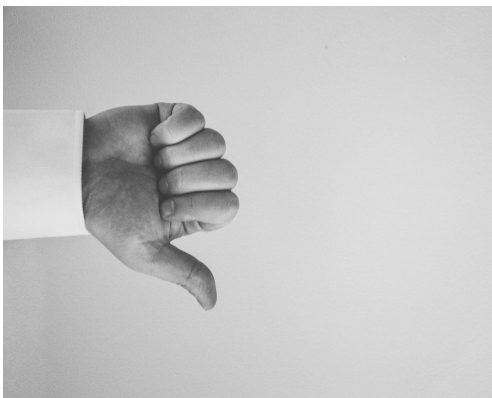
This Minisymposium is organized by the Young Investigators Section of SEMNI (SJIS) with the objective of encouraging networking and collaboration between researchers from different research institutions.

There will be three types of presentations, which will be organized in separate sessions of the minisymposium:



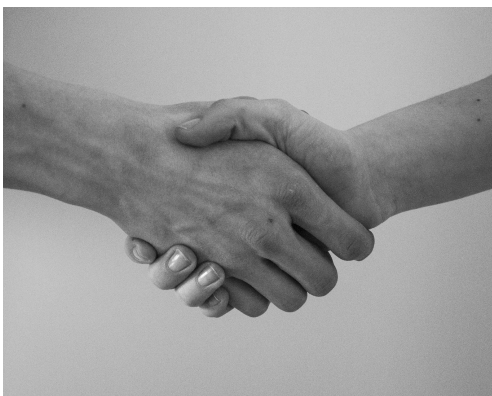
Presentation in pairs

Two presenters prepare and submit their abstract together. They should know each other but should not work at the same institution. The idea is to view a topic from two different perspectives, thus leading to intense discussions on pros and cons of the presented approaches.



Presentation of things that did not work as expected

The presentations are dedicated to those works which did not work or lead to different outcomes than expected. This gives the chance to present "negative" results. Authors should discuss why things went "wrong" with the aim to prevent others from falling into the same traps.



Presentation of networking and collaboration proposals

Group leaders and researchers interested in starting new research topics, collaborations or applying to European or National research projects can present here collaboration proposals, open positions, etc., with the aim of encouraging networking outcomes.
